COVID - 19 AND KEEPING OUR PATIENTS SAFE

The Georgia Institute For Plastic Surgery is committed to helping all patients in the Low Country and surrounding areas we serve. Each day, our practice sees cosmetic and skin cancer patients as well as covering local injuries and emergencies. Throughout the COVID-19 crisis we have remained open and continue to practice safe medicine and safe surgery by adhering to the following precautions:

- 1. Screening before you can access our office You will be asked appropriate questions about your potential exposure risk, any possible COVID-19 symptoms, check your temperature and ask that you to apply hand sanitizer. A mask is required to be worn inside our office.
- 2. Limited access to our office To reduce exposure risks to all patients, only the actual patient and one (1) guardian are allowed into the building. Under certain circumstances an additional support family member may accompany patients into the office for discussion after examination.

- 3. Testing All patients undergoing general anesthesia for surgery are tested for COVID-19 prior to surgery. Any patients testing positive are rescheduled to keep all surgical staff from being exposed.
- 4. Staff screening All staff members have been tested for COVID-19 and were negative. We continue daily screening of employees for COVID-19 symptoms, checking temperature and asking about any possible COVID-19 exposure. Any staff members showing symptoms of illness remain home until it can be confirmed with testing that they are negative. All staff are required to wear a face mask inside our office.

Now that elective surgeries are allowed to proceed, we are using these principles to safely treat all of our elective breast cancer patients, hand surgery patients and our cosmetic surgical patients.

WHAT IS OCULOPLASTIC SURGERY?

Oculoplastic Surgery is the treatment of injuries, diseases, and the appearance of the upper and lower eyelids. Plastic Surgeons and Ophthalmologists with special fellowship training share the treatment of these patients. As Plastic Surgeons, we try to refine the results and improve the final appearances. We perform a wide variety of cosmetic and reconstructive eyelid surgery. Some of the UPPER eyelid operations that we perform include:

- 1. Blepharoplasty removal of excess skin of the Upper Eyelid for cosmetic or functional reasons.
- 2. Ptosis repair elevation of "lazy" eye to improve vision.
- 3. Upper eyelid cancer reconstructive surgery.

We also perform LOWER eyelid procedures that include:

- 1. Removal of excess skin and fat bulges from the lower lid. Sometimes we simply remove fat bulges without external scarring.
- 2. Correction of lower lid sagginess with a procedure called canthopexy.
- 3. Lower eyelid cancer reconstructive surgery.
- 4. Correction of saggy lower lids with eyeball irritation- or Ectropion.

What are my options for Breast Implants placed over 25 years ago? It depends upon your goals. Many women have gained some weight with time and are actually larger than they hoped to be. Others may have concerns that their implants are ruptured. As a screening tool, we will order a mammogram and any pathology to see the status of your implants. Sometimes a MRI is necessary to determine if the implants are intact. If your implants are ruptured or should you decide to remove your implants, your options include:

- 1. Remove the implants and do not place new implants.
- 2. Remove the implants, do not place new implants, and do a breast lift.
- 3. Remove the implants and place new implants.
- 4. Remove the implants, place new implants, and do a breast lift.

All of these options can be reviewed with you at the time of your consultation. If the implants are ruptured, your insurance may pay for removal of the implants while you would be responsible for the cost of implant reinsertion and breast lift should you decide upon those options.

These procedures are done outpatient, and you can return to work with no heavy lifting after one week.

- Skin injuries
- Tendon injuries
- Nerve injuries
